Rectory Ramblings

Does the name John S. B. Monsell mean anything to you? He was born in Londonderry, educated in Dublin and became an Anglican minister in both Ireland and England. He was rector of Ballycastle and St Nicolas' Church, Guildford. Both places have a direct family link to the McConnell Clan (my granny was from Ballycastle and my son studied in Guildford). Rev. Monsell was even chaplain to Queen Victoria for a short time. What makes John Monsell famous (and all CLB members will be shouting this), is for writing well over 300 hymns including 'Fight the good fight'! Each verse echoes a verse from one of the epistles:-

Verse 1 - 1 Tim. 6:12

*'Fight the good fight of faith,
lay hold on eternal life'.*

Verse 2 - Heb. 12:1

*'Let us run with perseverance
the race marked out for us'.*

Verse 3 - 1 Peter 5:7


*'Cast all anxiety on him,
for he cares for you'.*

Verse 4 - Col. 3:11

'Christ is all, and is in all.'

The hymn is a call to faithfulness and is a timely reminder that at a time when some might be looking forward to not only a break from church, or, even a break from God (the summer holidays) the opposite should be the case. God (thank God) is never off duty, nor does he go on holiday. So please remember as you enjoy your holidays to pack your faith and your

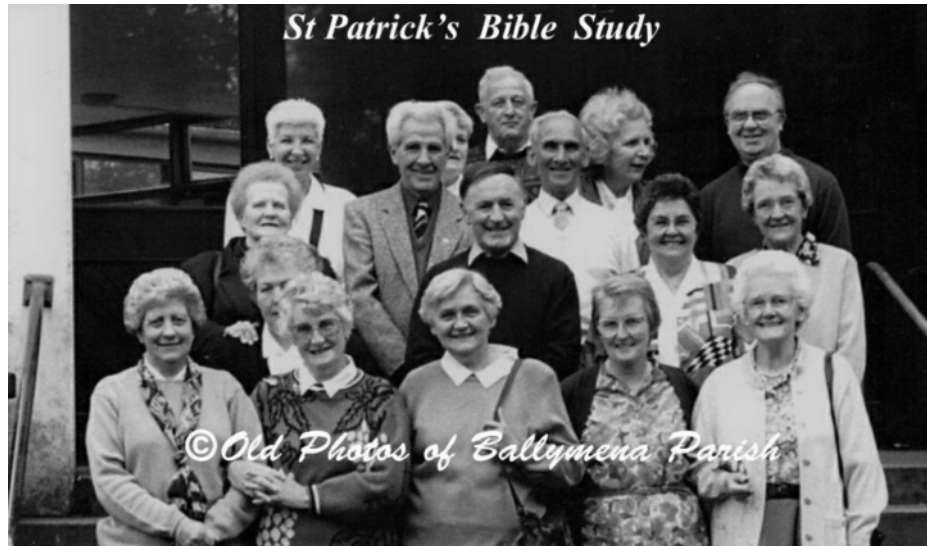

Christian Aid Week 2018

The total of our collections for Christian Aid Week *is* down on last year, with £455.20 being donated at the two lunches, £1,114.40 coming in on the plate at the three churches and £681.07 from the door-to-door collection; a total of £2,250.67. **However**, last year was an exceptionally good one and we must not forget the substantial sum that was collected throughout the parish for Christian Aid back in January, when the government had agreed to match any money raised, pound for pound. January's total (even without the government's contribution) together with what was raised during Christian Aid Week would take us over the sum raised in Christian Aid Week last year.

Whenever and wherever we have stretched out our hands to put money on the plate our parish has, as always, been generous. Christian Aid is always very appreciative of the generosity of all those moved to donate to their work - and the recipients of any aid even more appreciative. As we have seen in years past, and in the stories told this year, assistance given to an individual in a community can have a tremendous affect on their whole community as well as helping them to develop skills and industry to sustain and educate their own families.

I would like to thank everyone who helped in any way with our effort this year, including not only those who gave generously but also those who prepared and served lunches, those who went out collecting and those who helped count the money.

We have been wondering whether there might be other ways of raising money during Christian Aid Week; activities that we could undertake which might help raise awareness of Christian Aid and its work within the general public as well as perhaps raising more money for that work. This is a whole parish effort and ways of involving more of our members from across all three churches working together would be good. Our parish is, of course, just one of the groups working within Ballymena, but it is a good way of working and witnessing together.

The Weaver

Any suffering that we might face in life, can be hard to understand and hard to reason with. How often does life seem for us, and for those we know well, to be so unfair. We might ask the question if we have a good and loving God why must suffering occur at all? Tim Keller reminds us that, "Just because you can't see or imagine a good reason why God might allow something to happen doesn't mean there can't be one." As it says in Isaiah 55:8-9 'For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts'.

I came across this poem called 'The Weaver' which I thought I would share with you.

*My life is but a weaving
Between my God and me.

He weaveth steadily.*

*Oft' times He weaveth sorrow;
