

MORNING PRAYER

'Let this day be holy; Lord accept my prayer, and the thanks I offer for a Father's care'

Dear Lord,

Thank You for Your invitation to me to spend personal and intimate time with You every day. Forgive me when I have failed to do so. Teach me how to maximize my times with You. Come Lord Jesus.

Help me, O God, to meet in the right way and in the right spirit everything which comes to me today. Help me to approach my work cheerfully, and my tasks diligently. Help me to meet people courteously, and, if need be, to suffer fools gladly. Help me to meet disappointments, frustrations, hindrances, opposition, calmly and without irritation. Help me to meet delays with patience, and unreasonable demands with self-control. Help me to accept praise modestly, and criticism without losing my temper. Keep me serene all through today. All this I ask for Jesus' sake. *Amen.*

In this morning light some of the things I have to do seem to loom large before me, and I carry the prospect of work like a heavy burden weighing me down even before I begin. Yet by this evening many of today's difficulties will have passed. Maybe they will prove to have been far less arduous than I imagined. The thought of a problem so often turns out to be worse than the problem itself. Lord, lift my spirit, give me energy and a sense of humour through the hours of this day. Lord of the morning, help me. *Amen.*

Lord, help me today to realise that you will be speaking to me through the events of the day, through people, through things, and through all creation. Give me ears, eyes and heart to perceive you, however veiled your presence may be. Give me insight to see through the exterior of things to the interior truth. Give me your Spirit of discernment. O Lord, you know how busy I must be this day. If I forget you, do not forget me. *Amen*.

Lord, I do not know what this day may bring, but each moment is in your hands and I offer it to you in advance. Nothing that will happen or be said today can separate me from you. Let me rest assured in that peace. *Amen.*

Thank you, God for opportunity. Here is a new day, untouched by my hand, but held in yours. I need you, and you have chosen to need me. Together, we can bring to fruition some of life's endless possibilities. Thank you, God. *Amen.*

Help us, O God, to live this day quietly, hopefully; to lean on your strength trustfully, restfully; to wait for the unfolding of your will patiently, serenely; to meet other people peacefully, joyfully; to face every task confidently, courageously; in the name of Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Into your strong hands, our Father, we commend this day our souls and bodies, our work and the tasks that await us, our homes and families, our friends and neighbours, and all who specially need your help. Grant to each of us your all-sufficient grace, and keep us in peace and safety; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Lord, we offer you ourselves this day for the work you want accomplished, for the people you want us to meet, for the word you want to be uttered, for the silence you want to be kept, for the places you want us to enter, for the new ways you want pioneered. Go with us along the way, Lord, and enable us to realize your presence, at all times and in all places, our loving Lord Jesus Christ. *Amen*.

I bind unto myself today the power of God to hold and lead,
His eye to watch, his might to stay, his ear to hearken to my need,
The wisdom of my God to teach, his hand to guide, his shield to ward,
The Word of God to give me speech, his heavenly host to be my guard.
Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me,

Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger,
Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

EVENING PRAYER

'And now this holy day is drawing to its end; once more to you O Lord, our thanks and praise ascend'

O God, bless the people who are thinking of me and praying for me tonight, my family, my friends, my loved ones. Bless those who have no one to remember them, and no one to pray for them, the aged, the lonely, the friendless, those who have no one to love and no one to love them. Bless those who specially need my remembrance and my prayers, those in illness and in pain, those whose life is in the balance, those who are dying, those who are in bewilderment, those who are in regret and remorse, those who have been driven to despair. Bless me before I sleep, and grant me now a grateful heart for all your gifts; a contrite heart for all my sins; a heart at peace, because it rests in you. Hear this my prayer for your love's sake. *Amen*.

When I sit down and think at night, O Father, before I go to sleep, I always feel that there never has been a day when I have done all that I meant to do, and when I have been all that I meant to be. Somehow the day is never long enough, and my strength of will is never strong enough. Even in spite of my many failures keep me from discouragement; keep me from lowering my ideals; keep me from abandoning hope and from giving up. Help me to trust still more and more in you, and less and less in myself. This I ask for your love's sake. *Amen.*

O God, help me tonight to relax in body and in mind. Take from me the tension which makes rest impossible. Take from me the worries which fill my mind with thoughts which destroy sleep. Take from me the fears which lurk at the back of my mind, which come to haunt me when work is laid aside, and when there is too much time to think. Help me tonight really and truly to cast my care upon you, really and truly to feel the everlasting arms underneath and about me. Help me to sleep tonight, not just the sleep of tiredness, but the sleep of peace; through Jesus Christ my Lord. *Amen*.

O Lord my God, thank you for bringing this day to a close; thank you for giving me rest in body and soul. Your hand has been over me and has guarded and preserved me. Forgive my lack of faith and any wrong that I have done today, and help me to forgive all who have wronged me. Let me sleep in peace under your protection, and keep me from all the temptations of darkness. Into your hands I commend my loved ones and all who dwell in this house; I commend to you my body and soul. O God, your holy name be praised. *Amen.*

Give me this night, O Father, the peace of mind which is truly rest. Take from me all envy of anyone else, all resentment for anything which has been withheld from me, all bitterness against anyone who has hurt or wronged me, all anger against the apparent injustices of life, all foolish worry about the future and all futile regret about the past. O God, I started out today with all kinds of high hopes and resolutions, but it has just been another of these days. I have been just as easily irritated and annoyed as ever I was. I have been no kinder, no more considerate, no more like Jesus. Forgive me, help me not to be discouraged, and not to give up the battle for goodness. All this I ask for your love's sake. *Amen.*

Give me this night, O Father, the peace of mind which is truly rest. Take from me all envy of anyone else, all resentment for anything which has been withheld from me, all bitterness against anyone who has hurt or wronged me, all anger against the apparent injustices of life, all foolish worry about the future and all futile regret about the past. Help me to be at peace with myself, at peace with my fellow human beings, at peace with you, so indeed may I lay myself down to rest in peace, through Jesus Christ my Lord. *Amen*.
