The words of Agur son of Jakeh. An oracle. ¹Thus says the man: I am weary, O God, I am weary, O God. How can I prevail? ² Surely I am too stupid to be human; I do not have human understanding. ³ I have not learned wisdom, nor have I knowledge of the holy ones.*

⁴ Who has ascended to heaven and come down? Who has gathered the wind in the hollow of the hand?

Who has wrapped up the waters in a garment?

Who has established all the ends of the earth?

What is the person's name?

And what is the name of the person's child?

Surely you know!

⁵ Every word of God proves true; he is a shield to those who take refuge in him.

⁶ Do not add to his words,

or else he will rebuke you, and you will be found a liar.

⁷ Two things I ask of you;

A reading from the gospel according to St Matthew chapter 22 beginning at verse 34

In this passage Jesus quotes from the Hebrew scriptures the 2 great commandments of love and then turns the argument of the Sadducees and Pharisees upside down.

³⁴When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, ³⁵and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?' ³⁷He said to him, '"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." ³⁸This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." ⁴⁰On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.' ⁴¹ Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: ⁴²'What do you think of the

asked them this question: ⁴² 'What do you think of the Messiah?' Whose son is he?' They said to him, 'The son of David.' ⁴³He said to them, 'How is it then that David by the Spirit' calls him Lord, saying,

44 "The Lord said to my Lord,

'Sit at my right hand,

until I put your enemies under your feet' "?

⁴⁵If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?' ⁴⁶No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

TRINITY 19 - Ballyclug

26th October 2014

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians chapter 2 beginning at verse 1

Paul reminds the Thessalonians that his mission to them had not been like other preachers who did it for profit but freely under the gentle compulsion of the gospel.

¹You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, 2but though we had already suffered and been shamefully maltreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, 4but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. 5As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; 6nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, ⁷though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle* among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. 8So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

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
