

Rectory Ramblings

Sandwiched either side of our Christmas celebrations are the two seasons of our Christian Year we know as Advent and Epiphany. In all the razzle dazzle of this time of year their importance and meaning can often be overlooked. So for my Christmas thought this year I will stop for a while to unpack, a little, the joys and challenges of these two important and ancient times in our Church year.

Starting with Advent from the Latin 'Adventus' which means coming. Normally beginning on the Sunday nearest to 30th November, it lasts for the four weeks before Christmas. It is a time to prayerfully prepare for the Saviour's First Coming and to renew the spirit of expectation within us regarding the Messiah's Second Coming. In His first coming Christ demonstrates His total commitment to the whole of humanity, 'word made flesh'. From cradle to grave (manger to Joseph's tomb) we each one matter to God.

The perfection and completion of all of God's redemption plans will be brought about at Christ's Second Coming. Two more different arrivals can hardly be imagined (humble stable/trumpet blast heard around the world). In homes and churches across the world, in readings, prayers, wreaths, candles and even countdown calendars, Advent will be celebrated. It's clear overriding message - are you ready for the coming of Jesus?

The season of Epiphany normally stretches from 6th December right through to Ash Wednesday. Within this season we are encouraged to witness and ponder some key moments of awareness or realisation surrounding the birth of Christ.

Mary and Joseph realise this is no ordinary baby, John the Baptist Realises this is no ordinary baptism.

The Three Kings/Wise Men realise that they are following an extraordinary star. Of course, for Christians we are not only to be observing the wonder and awakening in the lives of these Biblical characters but to be seeking after a renewing within ourselves that God has come and made Himself known and available through faith and spirit to each person on earth. The message of Epiphany is clearly - Do I Realise What's Going On? What God has done in Jesus.

In wishing you all a wonderful Christmas and extending from the McConnell Clan our thanks for all your support and encouragement as we continue to settle in and come to terms with all the business and life of Ballymena and the Parish, I pray that the seasons of Advent and Epiphany might be recaptured, are you ready ... Do you realise ...

CHRISTMAS COFFEE MORNING AND CAKE AND CRAFT SALE





This month I'd like to begin by reminding you that as well as being members of the Church of Ireland, you have also by default since June 2015 been members of the charity which this parish became at that time. As you may or may not be aware Charity legislation changed, following a European Directive, requiring all organisations claiming to have a public benefit to register as charities, and the Church of Ireland chose to do this on a parish by parish basis both north and south of the border. By the end of October 2017 this parish had to provide certain information and reports about the calendar year 2016 to the Northern Ireland Charity Commission, and these are now available for any member of the public to see on the N.I.C.C. web-site. If you want to look at this search for Kilconriola, if you look for St Patrick's Ballymena you'll get Connor's information.

Around the parish the action is currently centred on the parish halls where there has been some electrical upgrading going on, with new distribution boards now in place to meet current (no pun intended) regulations. Similar work is now happening in St Patrick's, and not before time as Sunday 19th November saw us without the sound system for most of the 11.30 am service due to blown fuses. Similar upgrading is planned for Ballyclug too in the near future.

The halls are also having additional cabling installed to extend and improve the wi-fi coverage, and in the not too distant future we shall have a proper motorised screen and projector system installed on the stage which will be of benefit to several groups and increase the range of possibilities in using the hall. A new extraction system has been put into the kitchen too so that safe levels of ventilation are available to those using it without having to resort to opening all the windows and causing a freezing gale to sweep the whole place. Finally for now at the halls you will also soon see the replacement of the glazing around the court yard with new PVC units. There have been some concerns for several years about the state of the frames and wooden panels beneath these windows which this work will finally resolve. At the same time new external doors will be fitted to the Minor Hall.

As ever don't hesitate to let any member of the Select Vestry know if you have spotted anything else which needs attention, and in the same way if you can help with anything don't be shy about offering, many hands make light work.





A view from the pew

If you were to arrive at Church on Wednesday 13th December, for Holy Communion this year, what would you think if you saw the Fire Brigade and Police with a cordon around the church? On that day in 1879 that's exactly what you might have seen.

That day a severe fire had taken hold and there was quite a bit of destruction to the building, mainly caused by a poor lack of water pressure. The following day a meeting took place and watchmen were appointed to protect the contents that were still left in the building. The original builder was contacted along with the insurance company to get the claim underway. As a hand of friendship First Ballymena and West Church offered us the use of their premises for our services. After the work was completed following the fire in March 1881 the present building was opened once again, and on the 24th of March the Church was consecrated once again. For their help and kindness in our hour of need a set of 'collection plates' was presented to West Church.

It is ironic however, that about fifty years later the same thing happened to West Church and we were able to make our church and halls available for their services.





Watch Where You're Going!

I saw a teenage girl walking into school one wet morning with one hand holding a lever arch file over her face to keep the rain off, and in her other hand she was holding her smart phone. Not only could she not see directly in front of her, because of the file in front of her face, but she was looking down at her smart phone as she walked along. I presume that she made it to school in one piece, but I would not be surprised if she had bumped into the occasional lamppost along the way.



We all know in life that if we do not watch where we are going, it can very quickly end in tears. The amount of distractions we have in our modern world are many. Christmas for a lot of us can be one big massive distraction. Busyness, people to see, presents to buy, to-do lists. We can so easily take our eyes off the ball when we allow the pressures of Christmas life to take over.

Careful walking in the Lord, is the role of every Christian. In Ephesians 5:15-16, Paul tells us, 'Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil.' Paul reminds us that we need to be careful to walk in the ways of the Lord, to seek His will in our life, to be prioritising the work of the

Kingdom, as opposed to our own wants and needs. The Christmas furore can take us over and completely cloud not only the remembrance of what the season is all about, but also our Christian behaviour and values. Walking closely with the Lord is what we as Christians need to do all year round and even though we know what Christmas should be about, we can get so caught up in all the Christmas festivities and busyness, that our walk with the Lord is virtually non-existent. So look carefully how you walk this Christmas, avoid those lampposts, stay close to the Lord as you remember what He has done in your life, and don't allow the chaos of Christmas to take your eyes off the Christian path.


