

# Rectory Ramblings

### **HOW TO CELEBRATE CHRISTMAS**

In the middle of all the shopping and decorating and entertaining which so fills our diaries at this time of the year it is good to pause and consider how we might remember that Christmas celebrations devoid of any Godly content are really very wasteful and quite empty.

Re-read the account of the coming of Christ in Luke's Gospel chapter 1. From these great verses I want to suggest several things that might bring Christmas to life for us in a Godly sense.

A time for witnessing (v 17). The shepherds give us a good example, by the music we play in our cars and homes - by the Christmas cards we send and the messages they contain - by the Nativity Set which should take pride of place in our decorations - by making sure there is room in our diaries for praise and prayer at church. This list could go on and on. Be intentional to share Christ at this wonderful time.

A time for wonder (v 18). I came across a great old word the other day 'muse'. It means to sit back and meditate and think. Interesting to see what happens to that word when we add the little prefix a - amuse, the opposite of thinking seriously about anything. Is your Christmas all about amusement or musing? Here's a Christmas quote for you to muse on from G. Campbell Morgan, 'In the presence of such a holy miracle, there can be no fitting attitude of the human intellect save that of acceptance of the truth without any attempt to explain the mystery'.

Making time for witness and wonder should lead to a renewal in our appreciation and ability to worship in a meaningful way. This is the response we see in our friends the shepherds in our focus Bible passage

(v 20). I hope you will find time to step back from the Christmas stuff that robs Christmas of any power or meaning in order to let the real Christmas live in your heart and home.

Volunteers required please to help decorate the Christmas tree in St Patrick's on **Friday 9th December**. Please come along at 11 am if you are able to help.


### **ALPHA PRAYER TIMES**

Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year for 2017 to all our young people and leaders.



# The Curate's Letter

The Christie household has the yearly Christmas tradition of watching the Muppet's Christmas Carol on DVD together. The Charles Dickens novel 'A Christmas Carol' has been made into around 200 different film versions. It's popularity as a heartwarming story seems to be timeless. This is encouraging given that the Christian virtue of charity and goodwill to all is at the very heart of it's message.

Dickens himself has said, "It is Christianity to do good always - even to those who do evil to us. It is Christianity to love our neighbour as ourselves ... to be gentle, merciful, and forgiving, and to keep those qualities quiet in our own hearts, and never make a boast of them..." It is of course (though Dickens doesn't explicitly say so in the novel), Christianity to follow Christ. When we recognise our own state before God and turn to Christ and accept Him as our saviour, we can have a transformed life which strives to honour God by always trying to do good and to be gentle and forgiving to others.

Scrooge, before he sees the light, has made choices in his life that reflect a heart that has hardened and hardened over the years. But his realisation that he has been a sinful, selfish man and that he has a second chance to repent and change his ways, transforms his outlook and his life. We too can keep Christmas well all the rest of our days, as the reformed Scrooge did, by living our lives in sight of God's great mercy. God showed his love and mercy and forgiveness to us even though we didn't deserve or earn it (Romans 5:8). Living our lives in sight of what Christ has done for us on the cross needs to be our true motive for a transformed life that puts God's values and needs first in our lives.

So if you get the chance to watch 'A Christmas Carol' this year (whichever version) I hope your hearts are both warmed by the brilliant story, and softened as you think on Christ and what he has done for each of us.

The Men's Fellowship group arranged for the Action Cancer 'Big Bus', to be in the grounds of St Patrick's Parish Hall to allow for a number of FREE health checks for the men and women of the parish and the wider community. On the day a total of 42 Breast Screening and 13 MOT Men's Health Checks were carried out.

Following their appointments Mark, John and Dennis have now made a commitment to each lose a minimum of one stone in weight over the next few months, and in the process to raise a few pounds for Action Cancer. A 'Please Do Not Feed!' warning will now be issued to all our parishioners if you are being visited by any of the clergy. You are also permitted to



give them a good telling off if they are seen tucking into something they know they shouldn't be.

The Lord has used this course for many years to draw people into a deeper Christian faith, or, into faith for the first time.


We will be running a Parish Alpha each Tuesday evening in the Minor Hall at St Patrick's from 7th February - 11th April.

Amongst Rosalie's many other interests were sport - both playing and coaching, especially swimming and badminton, the Girl Guides - she was a Brownie leader and member of the Trefoil Guild, geology - she loved organising and being present at field study trips and was president of the Belfast Geological Society. Her church and her faith played a huge part in Rosalie's life - she was a church warden, a member of the Select Vestry and active in many inter church projects including the Ballymena Church Members Forum. St Patrick's was packed for the Thanksgiving Service and the rector spoke on the theme of the Power of God's Love from 1 Corinthians, chapter 13. Our prayers are extended to her husband David, her children Paul, Karen and Mark and the wider family circle. May the Lord strengthen you at this difficult time.

# **Alice Murray**

Alice Murray was born in Coleraine on Boxing Day 1923. She was the daughter of Nellie and John Doherty and was one of 13 children. Alice married Jim Murray in 1948, living in Coleraine and Belfast before settling on the Cullybackey Road, Ballymena from 1953 onward. Alice and Jim had two children Christopher and Carol.
