




CHURCH LADS' BRIGADE




Ballymena Parish Alpha 2017


YOUTH ALPHA


a particular focus on the work of the Urban



Jack Richmond was born on 14th December 1937. He was the middle one of five children. Jack grew up in East Belfast. He met Jean and she thought he was the most handsome man on the planet. They got married on 17th February, 1962 and had three children, Tracy, Keith and Victoria. He was a totally devoted Father. He was the good guy, all the discipline and rules were left to Jean. He taught them the value of respect which he practised himself and this was passed on to his grandchildren. He loved sport and was especially fond of Ballymena Rugby Club. This was like a second home for him and he had many friends there. Jack was greatly respected by his work colleagues and was known as the gentle giant, a true gentleman. He was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease twelve years ago and his health started to deteriorate. This was difficult for such a big strong fit man. He was a devoted husband to Jean and was heartbroken by her sudden death ten years ago. Our thoughts and prayers are with Tracy, Keith and Victoria and the family circle.

Many within the parish were shocked and saddened to hear of the death of Anne Preston in December last year. Anne was born in Carnlough in January 1938, the daughter of Michael and Mary McMullan. Anne got married to John Preston over 50 years ago in Craig's Church, Cullybackey, and they went on to bring up fours sons together, Michael, John, Paul and Mark.
