A recent letter of thanks from the Foodbank Co-ordinator:-

Thank you so much for your very generous donation to Ballymena Foodbank.

We are delighted to let you know that in May 2019 your contribution amounted to 116.3 kg, which enabled us to bless 69 local people, 41 adults and 28 children in crisis with 3 days' worth of emergency food supplies.

As a community wide initiative the Foodbank could not fulfil its intended purpose without the support of people like yourselves and so we are extremely grateful for your very practical support. Please pass on our thanks to everyone who has donated.

We have been extremely busy over the month of February and have watched our stock levels drop very quickly on some of the essential items needed to provide a nutritional parcel. Can you please pass on the list below detailing the items we are short of:

# Famous Prayers

Who has not heard of Florence Nightingale - born to a wealthy life, she turned her back on a future of enforced leisure and luxury? Because nursing was all but closed to ladies in England in the early to mid 1800's she travelled and trained in several hospitals in Europe before returning home in 1853 to become superintendent of a London Hospital for 'Invalid Gentlewomen'.

Shortly after the Crimean War broke out and Florence became a hero and legend often working twenty hours a day in squalid conditions to care for injured troops. Forced home by a bout of fever she received many



national and international honours including a brooch designed by Prince Albert and a poem written about her by Longfellow. A devout believer, here is one of her prayers.

# Where are you leading?

Oh God, you put into my heart this great desire to devote myself to the sick and sorrowful; I offer it to you. Do with it what is for your service. Oh my creator, are you leading every man of us to perfection? Or is this only a metaphysical idea for which there is no evidence? Is man only a constant repetition of himself? You know that through all these twenty horrible years I have been supported by the belief (I think I must believe it or I am sure I could not work) that I was working with you who were bringing every one of us, even our poor nurses, to perfection. O Lord, even now I am trying to snatch the management of your world from your hands. Too little have I looked for something higher and better than my own work - the work of supreme wisdom, which uses us whether we know it or not. Amen.

Another option is to help out for something specific. We also would love you to show our young people your skills. We have badges for so much and we would really appreciate it if you could volunteer to help out for a couple of weeks with what you are good at/know a bit about.

We are quite unique at 5th Ballymena as we have a lot of interaction between the sections. Leaders help out in whatever section help is needed at any time and we all get along very well. This is such a benefit to your child as they move up as their new leaders will be familiar to them.

So why volunteer? I personally do as my children have got so much from Scouting over the years that I feel I want to give something back. I believe in its values and want to help deliver it to the next generation. It gives our young people a great start in life and teaches them skills they would not find elsewhere. But the bottom line is its fun! We all enjoy it, have a laugh and we have a great bunch of children to work with. We also have a great, supportive bunch of parents!

Please have a think about how you could help and chat to us. We would love to see how you could help us in any way, no matter how small. Please remember that we are not asking for a massive commitment (although that would be super!) and you can leave at any time. But I know you will love getting involved as much as we do. 




# A view from the pew

# Christian Aid Week 2019

Once again the parish has come up trumps! A big thank you is due to everyone who played any part in our somewhat extended Christian Aid Week this year.



Many of you gave generously by putting money in envelopes on the church plate. Others

supported the two culinary events - either by going to the soup, cheese and roll lunch at St Columba's or by nipping in for a bacon butty between the two morning services at St Patrick's. Let's not forget that neither of these events would have happened without a few efficient people being ready to prepare soup, to cook bacon or to set tables - so many thanks to those willing workers. A very special thank you goes to Allen Meats who donated the bacon for the butties. The envelopes on the church plates brought in £1265.32 and the eating events together raised £553.01.

Thanks must also go to the stalwart few who are still willing to go out and collect door-to-door in the area allotted to our parish. Sometimes it seems a thankless task but we need to remember that this collection reaches people who are willing to give money to Christian Aid but don't themselves go to church. This year we raised £686.44 from the door-to-door collection; £686.44 that would not be there for Christian Aid's work without our small but willing band of collectors.

Further thanks go to Angela and Jim who made sure that all the distinctive red envelopes were kept carefully together and to Colin, Peter and Irene for collecting the batches of envelopes and helping to count the donations - large and small alike.

All together we are passing on more than £2504.77 to Christian Aid as a result of our efforts in that special week this year. It is more than the

amount collected and lodged because a substantial number of the donations were Gift Aided.

We are always ready to think about new ways of enhancing the way we mark and celebrate the work of Christian Aid during the special week in May. 
