Read Psalm 62 Read Matthew 25: 14-30 A Thought

So, we've come to our final Lenten reflection as we look to Palm Sunday and to Holy Week.

You will recognise the parable in Matthew 25: 14-30.

This is one of my favourite parables ... every time I read it, I hear something different; I learn something new.

It's another parable that Jesus tells about a master going away and leaving his servants with a job or responsibility... It's about him heading off and then returning to see how the staff have fared in his absence.

Jesus' first hearers would have understood the Master as being representative of God and the servants being representative of Israel. Jesus points to the fact that God had blessed Israel with all the tools it needed to be 'the light of the world;' to be His chosen people, God, through the Prophets had called Israel to be the means of His plan to rescue and redeem all creation. Israel had been given the means to do this. They'd been given the Land, the Temple, the Law, the structure of family and community. Yet, they had failed in their God-given responsibility. And they are failing to recognise the Messiah when He is right in front of them. They, like the third servant, had been given the chance to shine but they had failed to follow through. They, like the third servant, might have well as buried their God-given role and treasure in the ground.

There's a little story I love which talks about a man who wanted to be buried with all his worldly riches. After his funeral, someone asked his wife what it was she had decided to do about her husband's wishes. She replied "well, I wrote him a cheque..." A cheque can't be cashed when it's been buried underground and buried treasure is just that – buried. It's not doing anyone or anything any good buried in the ground.

Each one of us is blessed with a 'talent' or a 'gift.' The words of Jesus here remind us today that He has blessed each one of us with a gift to be used in His service. John Henry Newman said that each one of us is placed here on earth with a particular purpose and calling which only we can do. That purpose and calling is as individual as we are. It could be singing, cooking, playing the trombone, planting trees, treating the sick, providing hospitality, intercession or recording a little sermon video like this!

Jesus calls each one of us to exercise, use and share the beautiful, essential gifts He has given us. And He calls us to use the gifts of the Spirit, to live out the fruit of the Spirit as wise and loving human beings, His marvellous creation. Jesus invites us to be people who love God; celebrate His love for us; forgive; pray; seek justice; to be those who act boldly and wisely and to be those who live to see God's will be done here as it is in Heaven. And we're called to use our gifts – our talents – to serve Him in that.

If we are wise and trustworthy with our good gifts we can hope to hear those words: "well done good and faithful servant." To hear such words from an earthly someone whom we like and respect might bring us a glow of joy and satisfaction. But, to hear them from the Lord of Love, the Lord of Life, our Rock and Salvation? That will be greater than any joy, pleasure and delight we could ever imagine.

Let's pray:

Father we thank you that You are a good God who gives good gifts to His children. We especially thank you in this season of Lent for the gift of Your Son. Bless us with the power and encouragement of Your Holy Spirit and the love and compassion of Your Only Son Jesus Christ. And it is in Your powerful and holy name we pray. AMEN.

Into thy hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit.

For thou hast redeemed me, O Lord, thou God of truth.
