

Protect and guide all those who work in key roles to protect our health and safety, to treat the sick and to ensure that vital services remain open. Bless those known to us who are ill at this time, those in hospital, at home or in nursing care. We thank You, Lord, that You can turn our weakness into strength. Grant us all courage and fortitude to face the coming weeks. May we be people of compassion and care for people around us. May we truly be Your hands and feet here on earth.

We pray for our leaders; for those who have to make tough decisions for the good of us all. We pray for wisdom, discernment, integrity and a sense of calm for those in local, national and global politics and government. We ask for clarity and Your wisdom in how these leaders can help stop the spread of Covid-19 and protect us all, especially the most vulnerable in society. We ask for provision and release of resources that will help maintain, protect and sustain our health system. Jesus we ask for courage where courage is needed and patience where patience is required. We pray that these men and women lead well and are supported and encouraged by the public and Your Church. Amen.
