Affirmation of Faith

If you are able please stand as we affirm our faith: We join together to say: Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God almighty, who was, and is, and is to come.

We thank You that there better days on the horizon. We pray for wisdom for each of us as lockdown begins to ease.

So, draw close to us Father now as we bring our time of prayer to an end. Speak to us today, be present in our daily lives, inspire our hearts and renew our confidence. We ask all these things in the power of Your Son's name and by Your Spirit.
