Welcome and Opening Prayer

Lighting of the Advent Candle Lord Jesus, light of the world, John told the people to prepare, for you were very near. As Christmas grows closer day by day, help us to be ready to welcome you now. Amen.

<u>Confession</u>

A voice cries out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord.' So let us listen, and turn to the Lord in penitence and faith. John 1.23.

Jesus Christ, risen Master and triumphant Lord, we come to you in sorrow for our sins, and confess to you our weakness and unbelief:

God our Father, we come to you in sorrow for our sins. For turning away from you, and ignoring your will for our lives; Father God – We ask for Your forgiveness.

For behaving just as we wish, without thinking of you; Father God -We ask for Your forgiveness.

For failing you by what we do, and think and say; Father God – We ask for Your forgiveness.

For letting ourselves be drawn away from you by temptations in the world about us; Father God – We ask for Your forgiveness.

For living as if we were ashamed to belong to your Son; Father God – We ask for Your forgiveness. Amen.

Hymn 182 v1&3: Silent Night

Collect of the Day BCP p.243

O Lord Jesus Christ, who at your first coming sent your messenger to prepare your way before you: Grant that the ministers and stewards of your mysteries may likewise so prepare and make ready your way by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at your second coming to judge the world we may be found an acceptable people in your sight; for you are alive and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end.

> Almighty God, Give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Apostle's Creed BCP p. 112 I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. *Amen.*

Father God, Open the eyes of our understanding and prepare our hearts by the power of Your Spirit, that we may receive Your Word with much joy and rejoicing and may we leave here having a deeper understanding of Who You are. *Amen.*

for families who have lost their incomes and their homes;

for nations dealing with extreme poverty and famine;

for those who are denied justice;

for those who suffer violence and oppression.

We pray for our Brothers and Sisters in Christ around the world.

We especially pray for those suffering persecution because of their faith.

Lord, in Your mercy, hear our prayer.

Lord, teach us to appreciate what we have and to be aware of all that is done for us. We pray for those who, during this Christmas season, do not know the comfort of home, family and friends. We pray that all who have been bereaved at this time may be strengthened. We pray for our friends and loved ones ...

Lord, in Your mercy, hear our prayer.

Father God,

we thank You that You have created us to be people of faith and not of fear. Lord, You have done great things for us already, and yet, greater things are to come. We thank You that we can rejoice in You always: so we ask for Your strength to help us pray without ceasing and give thanks in all circumstances ... Lord, in Your mercy, hear our prayer.

The Lord's Prayer

BCP p. 112 Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Closing Prayer and Blessing

May we journey through Advent in joyful anticipation of the coming of our Messiah, in his manifold glory... and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among us and remain with us always. *Amen.*
